


Operational Update

Homelessness Action Plan (HAP)

- Rolleston St is a Single Site Supported Housing development which combines permanent housing with on-site support services.
- Response to the Aotearoa/New Zealand HOMELESSNESS
 ACTION PLAN, Phase One 2020-2023 (link available in minutes)
- This is a comprehensive central government-led and crossagency plan to prevent and reduce homelessness.
- Provides an overarching framework and sets out immediate and longer-term actions to prevent and reduce homelessness throughout our communities.





Homelessness Action Plan (HAP)


The plan outlines immediate and longer term actions to reduce and prevent homelessness, and will support over 10,000 individuals, families and whanau at risk of or experiencing homelessness. These actions are backed by over \$300 million of government funding, and build on significant investment in the Housing First programme and continued investment in public housing.

Two of the key commitments within this plan are to:

- Continue to roll-out Housing First places so that people experiencing chronic homelessness can access stable housing and are supported for as long as they need as outlined by the DCM and KWS presentations in previous sessions.
- Explore options for housing support and supported housing, with the aim that people can access the support they need for as long as they need it which is what we are doing now.

Rolleston is a key early adopter (second pilot site)

Rolleston Development

Update – 03 March 2022

Hawkins continue to progress well. We have roofing being installed to both front blocks (A and B) weatherline installed to Block C with windows due for delivery shortly.

These are big milestones for the development as it allows the buildings to dry out so we can really focus and accelerate our internal works.

Block D, whilst behind the other blocks in terms of work activity/sequence, continues to progress with framing installed to D1 and D4 and trusses underway to the areas that are ready for it.

We are due another large steel delivery on Monday 07 March. Hawkins have issued a letter (dated 02 March) to advise neighbouring properties of their requirements for access. They will be working with their traffic management contractor on the day to ensure disruption is kept to a minimum.









Block A roofing coverings now almost complete and the building is starting to be closed up.








Roofing has now started to Block B (photo taken just before works commenced). Mechanical & electrical 1st fix continuing.
