ALTERATION TO EXISTING TRAFFIC CONTROL: TEMPORARY TRAFFIC SIGNALS

This letter is to inform residents of Hankey Street (top & lower), Hopper Street and Arlington Street, of an alteration to our existing traffic control system.

From this coming **Monday 8th November 2021** we will be installing a temporary traffic signal system on sections of all three streets, as required by the coming stages of work. This means that from Monday, you will notice a new change in the layout of our traffic control. This system will run for the duration of this work.

A traffic signal operation aims to allow us to practically continue our work with enough space and in a safe environment, whilst ensuring safe passage for vehicles – using the **green, amber, and red** signals we are all accustomed to. As always, we kindly ask residents to follow the visible signage, heed the signals, and follow any directions given by our traffic management staff on-site.

As we require a clearway for emergency services, please be advised there will be a certain length of Hankey Street / Hopper Street which will remain a no-parking zone at all times. This is a requirement as part of our council traffic approval. As this work is staged—beginning at the top-end of Hankey Street—you will notice slight variations to our site set-up as we move down and eventually onto Hopper Street.
