

CIVIL INFRASTRUCTURE WORK IN YOUR AREA

WHERE: Between 54 Hopper Street to 68 Hankey Street.

START DATE: Monday November 1, 2021.

END DATE: Approximately six weeks after the start date (barring adverse weather or delays).

WORK HOURS: 7:00am — 5:00pm Monday to Saturday.

VEHICLE PARKING: 54 Hopper Street to 68 Hankey Street will be a **no-parking zone** for on-street parking (including coupon parking) during work hours. This will be in effect until the completion of our work. While normal parking can resume outside of these hours, be advised, parked vehicles must vacate this boundary between the hours of **7:00am — 5:00pm**, otherwise may need to be forcibly lifted-and-towed to a suitable park nearby. This is of course an action we would prefer to avoid.

It is advised to source temporary alternative parking for the duration of this work; this is to eliminate the chance of needing tow vehicles from our work areas. Also, please be reminded that traffic control equipment (cones, barriers, signage, etc), are placed down on approval from council, and it is illegal to tamper or remove such equipment at any time.

This parking instruction is due to spacing requirements and safety on-site; as part of our traffic control programme. We understand this is a disruption, so thank you very much for your understanding and cooperation with this.

ACCESS: As a resident you will still have access to your property at all times while we are performing this work. Our crew members will be on-site to assist wherever necessary. Just be aware, due to the fact of machinery and personnel on-site, there may be short-term delays at various times.

TRAFFIC CONTROL: Our traffic control team will be on-site at all times during work hours, and can assist the public wherever necessary for safe passage or direction around our work-zones. Please follow the instruction of our traffic control team, as they are there to provide safety. Vehicles are asked to please continue to follow signage and detours around Hankey Street and surrounding streets.

WEATHER: Work needs to be carried out during suitable weather conditions, if there is any significant delay to this work—past the approximate completion week—we will send out a subsequent letter to inform residents. However, this is a rare circumstance and not expected.

FURTHER WORK: This work is part of a larger project being undertaken in your area (Arlington Apartments Development); therefore, there may be future work needing to be done at another stage. If so, residents and businesses in the area will be informed in due course.

SAFETY ADVICE: Heavy machinery and equipment will be utilised for this work. Therefore, it is safety critical that the public heed signage and detours; whether driving, walking, or cycling. If you are stopped by a traffic control member, please listen and follow their instruction. *Multi Civil Contractors* greatly thanks all residents for their cooperation and understanding of this notice, as we aim to have this necessary civil work completed in a timely manner.
