Thank you for your email of 13 July 2018 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act):

- The total number of Housing New Zealand (HNZ) dwellings in New Zealand as of July 2018?
- 2) Do HNZ clients receive skip bins? Why is this? And how often are they provided with skip bins?
- 3) Can I get a breakdown, per calendar year between 2013 and 2018, of the number of skip bins provided to HNZ clients per region?
- 4) Can I get a breakdown, by area, of these numbers for the Waikato region area. E.g. Hamilton, Cambridge.
- 5) Which streets in Hamilton were provided with the most skip bins between 2013 and 2018?
- 6) What is the cost? Can this be broken down by calendar year, between 2013 and 2018, and by region
- 7) Is this a good use of Government money, to fund skip bins?

I have answered your questions below.

1) The total number of Housing New Zealand (HNZ) dwellings in New Zealand as of July 2018.

As at 31 July 2018 Housing New Zealand had 63,995 properties in its portfolio. This figure includes 1,494 community group housing properties that are leased to local service providers, and 661 emergency and transitional properties.

2) Do HNZ clients receive skip bins? Why is this and how often are they provided with skip bins?

Over the last five financial years, Housing New Zealand has provided an average of around 500 skip bins per financial year to its tenants. Housing New Zealand tenants may request or be provided with skip bins for a number of reasons including:

- As part of a community clean-up initiative
- where tenants are moved to another Housing New Zealand home to allow a redevelopment project to take place
- where a tenant is unable or requires assistance to clean up their home to meet the obligations of their tenancy agreement
- at the tenant's request, either during their tenancy or prior to vacating their property.

3) Can I get a breakdown, per calendar year, between 2013 and 2018, of the number of skip bins provided to HNZ clients per region.

Please find in Table One of the attachment, the number of skip bins provided by Housing New Zealand to its tenants. As Housing New Zealand collects and reports its data by financial year, this table and others in the appendix are broken down by financial year.

4) Can I get a breakdown, by area, of these numbers for the Waikato region area.

Table Two of the attachment provides a table breaking down the number of skip bins provided by Housing New Zealand to its tenants in the Waikato region, by TLA.

5) Which streets in Hamilton were provided with the most skip bins between 2013 and 2018?

Table Three of the attachment shows the streets in Hamilton where Housing New Zealand provided highest number of skip bins.

6) What is the cost? Can this be broken down by calendar year, between 2013 and 2018, and by region

Table Four of the attachment provides the cost of skip bins to Housing New Zealand tenants.

7) Is this a good use of Government money, to fund skip bins?

Housing New Zealand considers the provision of skip bins, when required, to be part of our obligation as a landlord, both under the Residential Tenancies Act 1986 and as a provider of state housing. Providing skip bins also helps our tenants to meet the terms of their tenancy agreements, and sustain their tenancies.

It is important to note that Housing New Zealand does not fund all skip bins, and in certain cases, such as when requested by a tenant, Housing New Zealand will arrange for the tenant to cover the cost of hiring a skip bin.
