Thank you for your email of 3 July 2018 requesting under the Official Information the following information:

1. *Please provide a timeline showing the steps HNZ took to stop pursuing debt owed by tenants for meth contamination. Please include on the timeline when key decisions were made, when those decisions were conveyed to the media, and what actions were taken to stop payments, contact tenants, etc.*
2. *How many tenants has HNZ contacted to tell them to stop debt payment arrangements since the release of the Sir Peter Gluckman report into meth contamination? And how many tenants has HNZ yet to contact?*

I am responding to your questions in the order raised.

1. *Please provide a timeline showing the steps HNZ took to stop pursuing debt owed by tenants for meth contamination. Please include on the timeline when key decisions were made, when those decisions were conveyed to the media, and what actions were taken to stop payments, contact tenants, etc.*

The timeline attached shows when key decisions were made and conveyed.

The Minister of Housing and Urban Development has also asked Housing New Zealand to produce a comprehensive report on our policies, processes and the outcome of methamphetamine contamination in our properties. The Minister intends to release the report publicly.

2. *How many tenants has HNZ contacted to tell them to stop debt payment arrangements since the release of the Sir Peter Gluckman report into meth contamination? And how many tenants has HNZ yet to contact?*

Housing New Zealand has identified 53 current tenants who were making payments toward their methamphetamine related damage debt. All have been written to and spoken to in person requesting that they stop making payments toward their meth related debt.

Should there be any other tenants identified in the future then the cessation of any payments will be addressed.
