Response to your requests for official information

Thank you for your requests on 30 May 2019 for information from Housing New Zealand, made under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act). This response covers all three requests.

State home numbers over the past ten years

The information that you have requested on state home numbers over the past ten years in Glen Innes, Marfell, Hastings, Tauranga, Porirua, and Wellington, is provided to you in full. This information is attached as Appendix 1.

Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration

Responses to the information you have requested about the Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration are provided below.

1. Can HLC and/or HNZ please provide a map of the current plan for redevelopment and indicate which streets and areas, exactly, will be affected by the redevelopment, including which houses wil be demolished, where new houses will be built, and the size, type and price of those homes. Or, if this is not possible, please provide any and all information that indicates where the redevelopment has been planned to take place and a map of where state houses are located in Porirua.

As planning is just getting underway there is currently no map of the development. This part of your request is refused under section 18(e) of the Act, which states that a request may be refused if the document alleged to contain the information does not exist or, despite reasonable efforts to locate it, cannot be found.

The development in eastern Porirua will transform the suburbs of Ranui, Cannons Creek, Waitangirua and Ascot Park. The partnership with Ngāti Toa in west Porirua will renew public housing in Titahi Bay, Mana and Tawa.

Details of the masterplan, including the precise locations of new builds, will be determined after comprehensive community engagement and planning. Feedback will be sought on housing, getting around the area, parks and open spaces, shopping and town centre, and community services. Community engagement began on 22 June 2019.

The exact properties to be demolished will be determined through the planning process. The condition of properties and whether they are fit-for-purpose will be considered, as well as how to make the best use of Housing New Zealand land. Houses that are demolished will be replaced with warm, dry, fit for purpose homes.

There will be a range of housing sizes and types. These will be a mix of public, market and Kiwibuild homes. Houses will range between one to five bedrooms, and will included terraced

and free-standing housing as well as apartments. Further detail on the exact housing mix will be determined after community engagement and planning. It is expected that about 2,000 Housing New Zealand properties will be renewed and there will be around 2,000 extra affordable and market homes, including KiwiBuild homes. The upper price limit for KiwiBuild homes outside of Auckland and Queenstown is currently \$500,000 (including GST).

The exact location of Housing New Zealand properties in Porirua have been withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the Act, to protect the privacy of natural persons; in this case our tenants. However, a list of the streets in Porirua where Housing New Zealand has properties has been provided to you (Appendix 2).

2. Where the funding for the Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration will come from?

Full details of funding, including transport and education aspects of the prgramme, will be looked at through a detailed business case that is expected to be approved in early 2020.

Housing New Zealand's Board has agreed in principle to financing the master development and public housing components of the regeneration programme, through revenue (such as rents), and by using external lending to cover the remaining amount required. After completion of the project, external lending would be paid off using the expected annual surplus generated from the public housing.

3. Who are all the partners of the redevelopment and what are their roles?

Housing New Zealand is the owner and manager of the land and public housing, and will fund the programme. Housing New Zealand also manages the tenancies and the tenants needs.

HLC, formerly Hobsonville Land Company, is the developer. HLC manages the entire programme, from the planning and design of homes, streets and neighbourhoods, through to the building programme and engagement of the local and wider community.

The Porirua City Council will work with HLC to ensure the programme aligns with the Council's Growth Strategy and District Plan review.

As mana whenua of Porirua, Ngāti Toa Rangatira has a special position of historical and cultural importance within the local community. To enable the Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration programme to proceed, Ngāti Toa Rangatira has agreed to the exchange of rights on a number of Housing New Zealand properties in eastern Porirua. In return Ngāti Toa Rangatira will upgrade public housing in west Porirua, while managing 900 Housing New Zealand properties and tenancies in that area.

The Treasury developed the Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration business case, in consultation with a rage of other government departments, before handing the project over to HLC to deliver.

Joint Crown, Porirua City Council and Ngāti Toa representatives will also make up a Regeneration Board who will provide oversight and own the vision, spatial strategy, and relationships between key partners. The Board will also make recommendations to Ministers and delivery entities (Housing New Zealand, HLC, Ngāti Toa and the Porirua City Council) to shape master planning, community engagement, and the provision of social services. The Regeneration Board will own the key strategic and political risks to the project.

4. Who is responsible for approving the Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration business case and the appropriation of funding?

Cabinet indicated their support for the implementation of the Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration business case and public housing expenditure in October 2018.

Approval will be sought from the Housing New Zealand Board to initiate the regeneration programme and approve the required funding.

- 5. Who are making the ongoing decisions relating to how community consultation is run?
 The HLC Project Team, in consultation with Porirua City Council and Ngāti Toa Rangatira, will decide how community consultation on the programme is run.
- 6. Who are making the ongoing decisions relating to which partners are brought on board?

 The HLC Project Team, in consultation with Porirua City Council and Ngāti Toa Rangatira, will decide which partners are bought on board for the programme.
- 7. Who are making the ongoing decisions relating to who tenders are offered?
 The HLC Project Team will decide who the tenders will be offered to.
- 8. Who developed the Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration business case?
 The Treasury developed the Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration business case, in consultation with other government agencies.
- 9. What people/organisations were consulted prior to the Eastern Porirua Community Regeneration business case?

The Treasury used statistical data and previous community consultation to inform the business case at a high level, and provide an evidence base to secure funding for the programme.

The following government agencies and organisations worked with Housing New Zealand, HLC, Ngāti Toa Rangatira and the Porirua City Council on the initial scoping work required getting Cabinet approval for the programme:

- Treasury
- Te Puni Kökiri
- Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment
- Ministry of Social Development
- Ministry of Education.
- 10. Which Ministers are directly involved with this project and what are their roles?

Hon Phil Twyford, Minister for Housing and Urban Development, is the shareholding Minister for the proposed master development and public housing expenditure, including community infrastructure.

The Minister for Housing and Urban Development is accountable to the Crown and responsible for the actions and performance of Housing New Zealand as a Crown Entity.

In April 2019 Minister Twyford set his expectations for Housing New Zealand for the 2019/20 year. As part of this set of expectations Housing New Zealand is expected to provide warm, dry and safe housing for our tenants, and help address the national housing shortage by delivering more state, affordable and market housing.

The development in eastern Porirua is one of the ways that Housing New Zealand will achieve this.

12. Is there any guarantee that all state housing residents will be able to remain in Porirua East throughout and after the process?

In 2018 Housing New Zealand created a policy of offering rehoused tenants the opportunity to return to the community they were moved from, should they want to. A full policy is currently under development.

The basic principles, which will also apply to tenants affected by the Porirua development, are below.

- Housing New Zealand will use best endeavours to rehouse tenants in the same area while construction of new homes is underway.
- Where the new home is a short term solution, Housing New Zealand will put the family back into a permanent home in the same community as soon as possible.
- In some instances Housing New Zealand may not have a permanent home immediately available in the same community. In those cases Housing New Zealand will work to find an acceptable home for them, and then move them back to their community as soon as possible.
- Returning to the community will be the tenant's choice. If they are happy and settled in their temporary home, Housing New Zealand will not move them unnecessarily.

Housing New Zealand will also help to facilitate moves by covering all reasonable costs associated with the move.

In rare cases state housing residents may not be able to remain in the Porirua area. In these instances Housing New Zealand will work with the tenant to find suitable housing in an area close by.

The areas of Glenn Innes and Marfell are defined by Statistical Area Unit (SAU) from 2009 to 2012 and by Census Area Unit (CAU) from 2013 to 2018. This is due to a change in the naming convention used by Statistics New Zealand. However, the geographical areas are the same.

The areas of Hastings, Tauranga, Porirua, and Wellington are all defined by Territorial Local Authority (TLA).
