CMcC- added, that this application is only for the subdivision (land enablement) of the first stage, and the CIA is expected to have more bearing on the resource consent for the subsequent house developments i.e. Architecture, green spaces, and cultural narrative. These subsequent consents are expected to be submitted (TBC – estimated to be 2024), there is time for the next consents.

RR - tabled putting in conditions that whatever comes out of the CIA should be considered in the future consent. Stated this has happened before.

KH – noted, commonly recommendations from CIA's are related to planting and SW management, the way they managed at the time is that those principles are clearly highlighted in the AEE and acknowledged in the SW design and to ensure they are implemented and delivered. The intention is to make it clear in application that this is just the start of the process, not the whole. Also highlighted the application at this stage is more for high-level. E.g.
