



I had a catch-up with Rachel and Andrew yesterday regarding the ecological considerations. Rachel mentioned that you verbally confirmed onsite that we will be using and designing box culvert and/or in specific ways to ensure fish passages and less disturbance to the streams.

So under the Resource Management National Environmental Standards for Freshwater, there are permit standards for culvert (see screenshot below).

Can you please confirm for me we are (or at least we are able to) design as per conditions? From my perspective, I do not need the detailed design, but more of a confirmation that this is what we propose and we are able to do it, so that Council has a level of certainty and confidence we can achieve this.

If these standards aren't what we are doing or we cannot achieve this, then can you please provide me a summary of what we are proposing and what we are likely to achieve, so I can address this matter appropriately. Again, I am not after massive changes to the report or detailed design, but I will need to know whether we need a consent or not.



I don't think this is guite as clear cut as you have stated below, as per my request for proposal email "Kāinga Ora wishes to engage an Ecologist for a residential land subdivision project in Ohakune, attached is a concept drawing of the proposed subdivision, this layout will be refined in January & February of 2023." We didn't just ask for an assessment of the current site.

I agree with your comment "At its most complex an ecological assessment of effects is an iterative process completed in collaboration with planners and other experts" and this has been occurring between Rachel, Morphum and Barker's.

That said, we still need the following for our consent application:

- 1. Ecological conditions of the existing streams and wetlands, including:
 - a. If the streams and wetlands have any significant and/or rare habitats

In order for us to review whether or not this work has been done in a way consistent with our professional standards and responsibility to the client, we need to have a clear understanding of the exact scope of the assessment the client is asking for, and documentation of the nature of the development.

During an internal review of the draft report Helen could not compare what was provided in the report with what was asked for in the brief (because there is no written brief or contract for that type of assessment), so could not sign the report off. She asked Rachel to remove section 4 until she had the brief and description of the development proposal and could complete her review. When the scope of works and proposal is understood it may be that more time is required to complete section 4 to ensure it is answering the brief appropriately. When the brief is clear the contract will need to be amended to set out that brief. An ecological assessment of effects to support a resource consent application is clearly outside of the scope of the services currently contracted. Attached is my completed report covering the field-based ecological assessment of the waterways at 6 Teitei Drive, Ohakune.

Last Friday you requested that I provide additional assessment of effects information on top of our original scope of work. Nave been working hard on those additional tasks this week, but during our internal review process have realised that the sum of these requests amounts to providing an Assessment of Environmental Effects, or AEE. This is a substantial piece of work in its own right, which requires a certain structure and planning support. Had I realised at the time what the additional information amounted to I would have paused and discussed with you a reasonable timeframe to complete this in full, and arranged a contract variation to cover it. However I was focused on doing what I could to meet your timeframes and missed that opportunity. I apologise for this oversight.

As soon as you are available next week it would be good to discuss the additional work that needs to be done, and a realistic timeline for its completion.

Ngāti Rangi Update – Tei Tei Drive

Tonight Te Totarahoe o Paerangi Ltd met to discuss the range of issues related to Tei Tei Drive Sale and Development Agreement.

As we have consistently advised, priority access to Ngāti Rangi whānau, if they meet the criteria set out by Kāinga Ora, is fundamental to our support for housing developments.

We do not wish to understate the critical situation for some 27 whānau who are currently experiencing homelessness in Ohakune and Raetihi; in addition to the 9 families occupying backpacker temporary accommodation for over two years.

We will continue to explore opportunities for priority access for whānau across the three tiers of the Tei Tei Drive housing development, and await the Minister's response with interest.

We do however, appreciate the commitment in the 2022-23 Statement of Performance Expectations regarding *Rautaki Māori o Kāinga Ora: Kāinga Ora Māori Strategy 2021–2026* and Kāinga Ora Strategy 2030. We recognise also that Whai Kāinga Whai Oranga was established to work with iwi and hapū to build new homes for whānau. These strategies lay a foundation for the expression and realisation of Māori aspirations for housing. The intention of co-design was for Kāinga Ora to demonstrate and prioritise co-partnership and base the strategy on the principle of partnership under te Tiriti o Waitangi. The goals of te Rautaki Māori o Kāinga Ora are:

- □ all Māori are housed in safe and affordable homes
- □ significant and efficient scaling of increased housing options for Māori
- □ Māori-led solutions to Māori issues with the support of government.

We acknowledge the obligation of Kāinga Ora to work with iwi and Māori to build and support genuine, meaningful and enduring partnerships that enables opportunities for Māori to both lead, deliver and contribute to housing solutions, and urban development projects.

It is in the context of all of these commitments that we are prepared to offer support, in principle, to the Tei Tei Drive developments.

Further, we are heartened by your commitment to understand the aspirations of Ngāti Rangi and to work with us to develop solutions to our dire housing situation.

We appreciate your interest in a Partnership Agreement and have drafted the attached for your consideration.

We have also tabled potential interest in exploring opportunities as a development partner through Hapai Development.

Fundamentally, we do not want to put the project at risk.



Tenā koe Helen,

Thank you for your summary of concerns below and please accept this update on behalf of the project team and Graeme who is in a full-day hui today.

Apologies for the length, but I have looked to cover these issues in some detail.

We have met with ^{\$9(2)(a)} this morning and progressed discussions begun at output on Thursday, with several key updated.

1. Comment in draft Assessment of Environmental Effects (AEE).

We acknowledge the concern raised by Ngāti Rangi regarding the comment included in the draft summary of effects. This summary report is dated 2nd June and was provided to facilitate discussion at the DPM hui on 8th June only. During that meeting we discussed several action items required as critical update to the final report, which have been captured in our meeting minutes as follows [extract from minutes]:

- Action Barkers to include appropriate reference to the Cultural Impact Assessment (CIA) in the AEE including the expectation that this report will be a key informant of the subsequent applications (KH).
- Action KH to ensure the AEE has referred to the Ngāti Rangi Taiao Management Plan.
- Action GT to discuss and preliminary concerns relating to land use RC with FC and Kahu
- Meeting is to be arranged with Cheals, RDC assessors and K\u00e5inga Ora. GT extended invitation to FC to attend to ensure Ng\u00e5ti Rangi Storm Water (SW) concerns were appropriately addressed.

Please be assured that we have been working through these since last Thursday and have undertaken to circulate an updated copy for Ngāti Rangi's review and further comment. This is expected to be available early next week, following receipt of the updated ecology report and Morphum report, which are expected Friday 16th June. I have attached a full set of the minutes from last Thursdays hui for your reference.

2. Engagement with RDC on storm and waste-water

We acknowledge the ongoing concern from Ngāti Rangi regarding storm-water treatment within the proposed Teitei Drive site and the concerns for broader infrastructure capacity in the Ohakune area. These remain open issues and we have agreed to the following action:

- a. **Teitei Drive design:** Following agreement on the 8th June, a meeting has been scheduled for 20th June with ^{\$ 9(2)} Giles, Vini (RDC) and Stuart (RDC) to discuss storm-water design, specifically to address the key design considerations of the detailed design for 3 waters infrastructure within the proposed development.
- b. Broader infrastructure programmes of works outside the Teitei Drive site: ^{\$ 9(2)}/_(x) s due to meet with RDC regarding this on 16th June. Käinga Ora have offered support in facilitating these discussions should this become required, but we understand this is progressing well at this point.

- 3. Clarification of resource consent process with consideration to CIA and resourcing. During our hui this morning, we talked through the process of lodging the multiple consents for this project and the impact that would have on the CIA and vice-versa. This discussion sought to provide comfort that the CIA was on track for inclusion in the consent process and the findings would be given due consideration and not rushed through. Our consent process is two step, with the following intentions and inclusions:
 - a. Land application current consent under development.
 - a. This consent only seeks approval for land enablement, including roading network for stage 1, bulk infrastructure (storm-water, waste-water, electricity and chorus enablement). The result of a successful application process will be our ability to deliver roading, 44 lots marked on grass only, bulk infrastructure and streetlights only. There may be a requirement for a transformer too, but this is still tbd.
 - b. The current land enablement current application is a pre-curser to the full resource consent process detailed below, but importantly is the trigger for the CP funding.
 - Full Resource consent (vertical build/above ground) targeting mid 2024 for submission, following after land consent application
 - a. This will be the form of consent more familiar to the process. This consent will look to define the end development in its entirety, including built form (location, size and orientation of homes, home and area landscaping, storm water collection (retention/detention) and use from developed properties, cultural narrative for neighbourhood and shared spaces, design standards, encumbrances etc
 - b. This is where the key findings from the CIA will be designed in and our commitment to use the CIA as a foundation document to the design if the neighbourhood and submission of consent is clear. The August date for draft CIA report is well within the programme to enable this to be a foundation informant. Our upcoming work in the stakeholder engagement stream will also be critical to this application.

I understand that ^{servan}will de-brief you independently on our hui and I welcome any follow up topics regarding these proposed next steps should you have them.

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Tēnā koe Graeme i nga ahuatanga o te wa

I want to bring to your attention an issue that we have in relation to the draft assessment of environmental effects for Teitei Drive.

There is a statement in that draft, to the effect, Consultation with Ngāti Rangi is ongoing, and based on discussions to date no matters of concern have been raised. As you will be well aware, this is far from true.

We have been raising concerns regarding TeiTei Drive, and in particular our concerns around stormwater management (which there is no detail or report) from the onset of this process.

I have attached, as an example, the minutes from a meeting on 12 December 2022 where it states:

- HL noted Ngāti Rangi's concern with the capabilities of the wastewater infrastructure, (3.4)
- HL questioned what assurances there are around managing the water quality, given the current heavy rain weather, until the new water treatment is online. (4.5)
- HL noted the concerns raised as an iwi organization are driven by two key considerations: a) environmental concerns i.e.: waste water, infrastructure capacity, drinking water quality, (5.2)

Concerns about wastewater infrastructure were also raised directly with you in a letter of 7 December 2022 (attached).

Under the Official Information Act, it would quickly be revealed that these issues have also been raised with Ministers, namely Ministers Wood, Henare and Williams (attached above).

I am aware that both s 9(2)(a) keep comprehensive notes of all engagements with stakeholders, and have a meticulous record of issues raised. This is for our own processes of accountability and transparency, in terms of being consistent with the feedback we provide. For the purpose of raising this issue I have not asked them to provide me with those notes, but am happy to do so, if further evidence is required.

My staff advise me that at the latest Development Partners bui on 8 June 2023, these issues were relitigated, specifically our urgent request for a stormwater management plan. We are deeply concerned that the methods being proposed for mitigation are inadequate. This is an issue raised in our early meetings with Kainga Ora, and at the CIA site visit on 30 May, which Kainga Ora was present for

Tēnā kautau me ngā tini āhuatanga o te wā. Huri atu te pō, nau mai te ao.

Ruapehu District Council recently agreed to sell a plot of 9ha at Tei Tei Drive in Ohakune to Kāinga Ora for ^{\$ 9(2)(1)}This was done without reference to Ngāti Rangi and apparently without public consultation more broadly.

Kainga Ora wishes to develop the land for social housing; worker accommodation and affordable housing.

Ngāti Rangi are happy to support so long as we can have an influence on outcomes.

We would like to have a mechanism to place at-risk uri into a minority of the total houses (156) to be developed. Currently there is no capacity in the social housing allocation for prioritisation of houses for Ngāti Rangi whānau.

Yet Ngāti Rangi make up a disproportionately high percentage of those in need in the rohe. Over the last five years, Ngāti Rangi has supported 64 whānau across the region with basic repairs and maintenance to housing stock. We have supported whānau in Ōhakune, Raetihi, s 9(2)(a) Waiouru, and National Park. Through this process we have a register of whānau whom we know would benefit from supportive public housing arrangements.

In addition, there are at least nine Ngāti Rangi whānau that we know, today, who are in emergency housing. s 9(2)(a)

Ngāti Rangi is a member of Ka Uruora, an iwi led housing charity. Our proposition is to provide priority access to whānau, if they meet the criteria set out by Kāinga Ora, through Ka Uruora. This has been rejected outright by Kainga Ora. They have stated that this is due to are policy criteria that requires Ministerial approval to change.

Can you please consider whatever change is required so that Kainga Ora and Ruapehu District Council are able to demonstrate their value in the relationship with Ngāti Rangi and we can help them deliver to those in need via our own networks and resources? We would also appreciate Kainga Ora taking a more structured and pro-active approach to engagement with Ngāti Rangi in the future. We understand this is an issue throughout the motu with other iwi and Māori organisations.

Finally, we have frequently raised during this process whether Ruapehu District Council has sufficiently addressed the wastewater infrastructure in order to accommodate the demands of new housing stock. We have been often told that this plan is in process; that there are interim measures in place. We require assurance of long-term solutions for the wastewater management. Ultimately this is about the weilbeing of our whānau and all our mokopuna to come. If you have any questions or queries, please do not hesitate to contact me.
