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1. Updates

Commerce Commission's application to intervene in the Winton litigation

In our Briefing for the Incoming Minister (BIM), we informed you about our litigation with Winton Land Limited. We are providing this further briefing on a recent development – we expect the Commerce Commission will apply to the Court to intervene, and Kāinga Ora will consent to this

Neither the Crown nor Ministers are party to the proceedings. The litigat on is being managed by Kāinga Ora as an operational matter.

Background

In October 2022, Winton Land Limited, and its subsidia y, brought legal proceedings against Kāinga Ora, alleging that our organisation is engaging in anti competitive behaviour in breach of section 36 of the Commerce Act 1986 (misuse of market power). Kāin a Ora is alleged to have done this by restricting access to the Specified Development Project (SDP) process – allegedly only selecting greenfield developments that advantage Kāinga Ora; by

- outbidding private sector developers like Wint n for suitable land; and
- forcing private sector developers like Win on to participate only in particular aspects of a development (for example, by pu chas ng already consented land from Kāinga Ora, constructing houses and on-selling them).

Kāinga Ora strongly rejects the claims of anti-competitive behaviour and is defending the proceedings. We continue our urban development work in increasing housing availability for all New Zealanders, providing a range of housing options to enable more people to own their own homes in locations close to jobs, transportation, education, and other amenities. The focus is on creating thriving communities to benefit all New Zealande s, generally achieving over and above what the private market is able, or willing, to do.

Recent development

The Comme ce Commission has advised the parties that it wishes to intervene in the litigation. This means it asks the Court if it can provide submissions at the hearing (set to commence on 1 September 2025) in relation to legal and economic principles to assist the Court. It is not the role of an intervenor to express a view on the merits of a party's case. The Commerce Commission is doing so given its role as the independent agency that administers and enforces the Commerce Act and because this proceeding is likely to be the first proceeding under section 36 of the Commerce Act since its recent amendment. Section 36 is the provision under which Winton is suing Kāinga Ora (alleging misuse of market power).

The Commerce Commission's request to intervene is understandable given its position as the expert regulator and interest in section 36 generally. We expect that the Commerce Commission will file its application seeking leave of the Court to intervene shortly, given that there is a case management conference set for 20 February 2024.

Kāinga Ora intends to consent to the application, so it is very likely the Court will allow the Commerce Commission to intervene. Following such a decision (on or around 20 February 2024), we expect the Commerce Commission, and possibly also Winton, will issue a media statement.

Kāinga Ora will respond to any media enquiries it receives noting:

- Kāinga Ora welcomes the expert assistance the Commerce Commission can provide to the Court with legal and economic advice in respect of the recently amended section 36 of the Commerce Act.
- We understand the importance of correctly interpreting legislation, particularly when that legislation is fairly new.
- As the independent agency that administers and enforces the Commerce Act, the Commerce Commission is well placed to explain the recent changes to section 36 of the Act.

Rotorua community engagement

Two community drop-in session will be held in Rotorua on 8 and 20 February 2024, to share current public housing development plans for the central and west parts of the city. These follow an earlier session held for Rotorua east late last year and are part of a planned portfolio approach to sharing with the community and stakeholders about the approximately 500 homes which are in early planning, consenting or under construction across the city.

Those attending will have the opportunity to understand what is being built and where and find out more about any of the developments. The drop-ins support letters which are sent at an early planning stage to all properties in the vicinity of each development to let them know what is being considered, with information about all developments also available online at letstalk.kaingaora.govt.nz/Rotorua. Media will also be invited to attend the drop-ins.

OIA and Ombudsman six monthly statistics

Kāinga Ora is reporting its results for OIA responsiveness and Ombudsman OIA related complaints performance to the Public Service Commission (PSC) on 2 February 2024. The PSC is scheduled to publish the results on 13 March 2024. The table below shows the results to be reported.

Kāinga Ora achieved 98.1 percent timeliness for the July – December 2023 period. Timeliness is categorised as a response to an OIA request deliverwithin statutory timeframes. Overall 421 OIA requests were completed, with 413 completed on time. The percentage of extended OIA's was 25%. The public sector average for the last reporting period was 98.2%.

The past six months has seen the largest volumes of OIAs ever responded to by Kāinga Ora. In 2022, we completed 512 OIA request across the entire year. In 2019, the annual total was 330 OIA requests. Our systems and processes have developed over time to meet these increased volumes and levels of scrutiny.

We will share our current results with the Ombudsman Investigation team.

It should also be noted that our number of OIA extensions relative to requests is tracking down. For this period, it was 25 percent compared to 38 percent and 51 percent for the previous two periods respectively.

For the total calendar year of 2023, Kainga Ora completed 698 OIAs. Timeliness across the year was 98.3 percent with 686 responses delivered within statutory timeframes.
