

### 2. Updates for Hon Chris Bishop, Minister of Housing

#### Memorandum of Understanding between Kāinga Ora and Matawhaanui Trust

- On 24 April 2024, Kāinga Ora and Matawhaanui rust, supported by Ministry of Social Development, signed a Memorandum of Understanding to commence a pilot that will see Matawhaanui providing housing support and wrap around services for 40 Kāinga Ora households in Huntly. Matawhaanui is the mana whenua Community Housing Provider in Huntly.
- Kāinga Ora will still legally be the landlord for the 40 households and will maintain responsibility for maintenance functions. MSD will fund the pilot to enable delivery of support services and connection to wide Matawhaanui services, including employment and training opportunities.
- The signing of this MoU and the pilot project supports Matawhaanui Trust's aspirations to build their capability o p ovide housing services in their rohe.
- The MoU will be reliewed every six months and quarterly reporting will measure its
  effectiveness via a number of key performance indicators including; what what what is a satisfaction,
  alignment with a Te Ao Māori led approach, maintenance and whānau feeling connected to
  t eir ommunities.

#### **Auckland International Airport judicial review**

- On 9 December 2022, Auckland International Airport Limited (Airport) lodged judicial review proceedings against a decision of Auckland Council to grant resource consents for subdivision and land use in respect of a mixed-use development at 9 Osterley Way, Manukau. The resource consent was lodged by Kāinga O a in May 2022 and included 123 residential dwellings. Kāinga Ora were named as Second Respondent by the Airport in their application for review.
- The site falls within the Metropolitan Centre Zone and is subject to the Moderate Aircraft Noise Area (MANA) contour within the Auckland Uni ary Plan. The Airport seeks that the decision to grant consent be quashed and it e given standing as an affected party in relation to consideration of any subsequent residential applications relating to the site.
- The grounds for the review relate to the potential for future residents of the development (and any residential developments within the Airport's noise contours) to complain about aircraft noise in such a way that might lead regulators to place restrictions on the Airport's future operations. The hearing is set down to be heard at Auckland High Court on 6 and 7 May 2024.
